### 2020 Reflection

16<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 13:24-30

Matthew follows up the parable of the sower with another parable of his own about different kinds of seed and sowing, focussed on the fact that the Church includes the bad as well as the good – or is it addressed to each of us, for each of us includes the bad as well as the good? It is not easy for the untutored eye to distinguish wheat from darnel, even in modern farming, despite the developments of modern wheat.

In any case, Matthew likes contrasting figures. We have already had several pairs of images at the end of the Sermon on the Mount, the broad road used and the narrow gate, etc. Many of his longer parables are based on such oppositions, the two sons, the guests at the wedding feast, and especially the parables of the coming judgement and the last judgement. On the whole his characters are rather caricatures of good and bad, with no more than the minimum of stark colouring, unlike Luke's characters who tend to be likeable rogues with both good and bad features (like ourselves!). Because of this the reader of Matthew is always aware that there will be a stark day of reckoning at the end, at harvest-time.

The parable of the darnel could almost be a continuation of the parable of the sower, an illustration of the different progresses of the seeds in action, the next stage after the sowing. In chapter 18 on the community Matthew shows that there are members of the community who put obstacles in the way of others; they are lost sheep who need to be reconciled; they are sinners who seek forgiveness but unwilling to forgive others. There are even those who need to be unfavourably judged. This is the mixed community in action! (HW)

#### **From Canon Geoffrey**

This past two weekends, for the first time since 20<sup>th</sup> March, public masses have once again been celebrated at Holy Souls' and St Bernadette's, Scunthorpe. My sincere thanks to a small, but dedicated group who have spent many hours, burnt midnight oil preparing documentation, photographic evidence, deep-cleaning and rearranging furniture so that we were in a position to obtain the necessary permissions in line with Government and Diocesan Directives to open these two Parish Churches.

Each of the ten masses celebrated over these weekends have required teams of volunteer stewards and cleaners of at least a minimum of two people, preferably three, to ensure that the churches could be made not only accessible, but primarily safe and secure for people to attend. Over the weekend approximately 8 hours have been spent cleaning after the masses so that they were available for the next mass.

Cardinal Nichols and Bishop Patrick acknowledged that initially not all Parish Churches would be able to open immediately for Public Worship. That is true. Currently, St Thomas of Canterbury, Gainsborough, and St Norbert's, Crowle, along with many other Parish Churches and Chapels throughout the Diocese have not opened *as of yet*, be it for private prayer or Public Worship. However, over the coming weeks, in consultation with members of those communities I hope to address how best to move forward and if at all possible consider what can be done.

Please be assured I am aware of the needs of our all our parishes, but we must tread carefully, and ensure that we are guided and governed by the need to have safe and accessible Churches whereby we can celebrate the Mass and Sacraments in an environment that meets current regulations.

May I make an appeal – please consider volunteering as a steward or cleaner. You should be over the age of 18, have no underlying health problems, be isolating or caring for someone who is isolating. Full training and induction will be given.

Thank you all for your patience and co-operation at the moment.
