Canon Matthew's Catechism

Why did God have to show himself to us?

God had to reveal things about himself to us because, although we can know that he exists by the use of our reason, we cannot really know God's nature using this same method. Therefore, God chose to reveal his nature to us gradually over time, and in various ways. He did not have to do this, he did it out of love. From the first human beings, down to the era of the patriarchs and prophets of the Old Testament God slowly, over many centuries, revealed himself. However, the definitive revelation of God's nature came with the coming of God the Son in the flesh, known as the Incarnation.

How does God reveal himself in the Old Testament?

First, we are told that God created the world out of love. Then the first covenant is made with Noah, with him God promises he will not destroy the earth or its people through natural disaster. Next God calls Abraham to be the father of the Jewish people, and ultimately the father of all people of faith. Then he rescues the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt under the leadership of Moses. During their journey to the Promised Land of Israel, God reveals his Law to Moses on Mount Sinai, including the Ten Commandments. Once the people are settled in Israel, God reveals himself and his plans further through the prophets such as Jeremiah, Isaiah and Ezekiel. The prophets communicate to Israel that God will one day send them the Messiah, and an everlasting covenant and kingdom.
