### The Life of St Pius X, Feast day August 21st, by Sam Hart

On Saturday we celebrate the memoria of St Pius X. He was one of ten children born to a poor Italian family in the village of Riese, near Venice. He began studying at seminary at the young age of 15 and was ordained a priest at the age of 23. After some time as a parish priest, he was bishop first of Mantua and later of Venice. During this time, he became well known for his work with the poor. Against his wishes he was elected pope in 1903 and chose the name of Pius because "As I shall suffer, I shall take the name of those popes who also suffered." Even after his election as pope he lived in great poverty and, unusual for his time, preached sermons regularly in the courtyards in the Vatican.

In 1908 the Messina Earthquake devastated parts of Italy and he allowed the Apostolic Palace in the Vatican to be filled with refugees, well before the Italian government acted to help.

St Pius X lowered the age of First Holy Communion for children and encouraged Catholics to regularly receive it. This practice continues today but, prior to St Pius X, Holy Communion was often only received once a year. Perhaps most famously St Pius X took steps to combat what he referred to as the heresy of "modernism" which is to try and change the Catholic faith to fit the mood of the times. Pius X condemned modernism as embracing every heresy and was gravely concerned about its growth within the Catholic Church. He preached against war and violence and had visions of an approaching war. Pius X encouraged Catholics to pray for peace and was heartbroken when, during the last days of his life, he saw the outbreak of World War I. He was known for performing miracles during his lifetime and the call of his canonisation began immediately after his death, on 20th August 1914. The Italian press responded to news of his passing with the words "the Saint is Dead." He was canonised in 1954 and his birth town was renamed Riese Pio X in his honour.

### Celebrating Mass at Holy Souls' and St Bernadette's

We ask that parishioners:

- Support NHS Test, Track and Trace by signing in with the QR code if you have a smartphone or sign and post the contact slips of paper in the post box provided.
