So by selling their produce this will prevent Christians from leaving the country in search of better work opportunities, as a test survey from the Bishops of Jerusalem found there is only forty one thousand Christians left in the area.

Day for Life - 19th July 2022

The Day for Life is the day each year on which the Catholic Church in Great Britain and Ireland focuses on the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition. Life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death and so, this year, our Bishops are inviting us to reflect on caring for and valuing the elderly. The COVID pandemic has highlighted the desperate plight of many older people, especially those in care homes and those struggling with long-term chronic conditions such as dementia. They carried the highest burden which included prolonged isolation, the distress for families being unable to visit, delayed medical interventions and tragic isolated deaths followed by shortened minimal funeral rites. Many family members and friends continue to bear the wound of deep grief which hurts and is still in need of healing. This year, Pope Francis has been using his weekly General Audience to offer in-depth catechesis on old age, and he has said: 'The little ones learn the power of tenderness and respect for frailty: irreplaceable lessons that are easier to impart and receive with grandparents. For their part, grandparents learn that tenderness and frailty are not solely signs of decline: for young people, they are conditions that humanise the future.'

There will be a second collection over that weekend to assist life-related activities supported by the Church. *(article by Fr Andrew Cole)*
