Father Matthew's Weekly Catechism

How could Boris Johnson, twice-divorced, be allowed to marry in the Catholic Church?

Many of you will have héard that our Prime Minister, a baptized Catholic, although non-practising, married his 🕌 partner Carrie Symonds last Saturday at Westminster Cathedral; she is a practicing Catholic. I, personally, am very pleased that we have our first ever Catholic marriage of a Prime Minister, because it makes us Catholics look 🛱 a bit more main stream. However, many of you will have heard that Mr Johnson has married and divorced twice 🕃 before, and you may have wondered how it could have been possible, given that we Catholics are supposed to believe that marriage is for life. How therefore could Mr Johnson be presumed free to marry in the eyes of the Church? Well, just as a wedding cake has to have certain ingredients before it can be deemed a wedding cake, a 🛭 🛣 Catholic marriage also has to have some basic common ingredients right from the beginning. The couple must be a man and a woman; who freely consent to marry; who are mature enough to understand what they are doing; and who intend to remain faithful to one another; to offer love and support to one another, and who are open to the blessing of children should God will it. If any of these ingredients are subsequently found to be missing then the marriage may be set aside or annulled. If a marriage is annulled it means that it lacks at least one of the essential ingredients of a marriage listed above from the beginning. This is one way a marriage can be declared 🔯 invalid or annulled. Another is when it lacks canonical form. This is when the marriage ceremony itself is invalid for some reason. This is always the case if a Catholic gets married in a register office, or gets married in anlid for some reason. This is always the case if a Catholic gets married in a register office, or gets married in an-other Christian denomination without seeking a dispensation. This is because Canon Law states that all Catholics should normally get married within their own Church. This is perfectly reasonable. After all, under most circumstances, why would a Catholic who valued their faith wish to get married anywhere other than a Catholic Church? It is because Mr Johnson, a baptized Catholic, chose not to marry in a Catholic Church for his first two unions, that these could be set aside for lack of canonical form. This is quite a common procedure, not just for the great and the good, but for ordinary people as well. I have dealt with several cases of lack of canonical form in my ministry over the past twenty years. Mr Johnson was, therefore, free to marry in the Catholic Church to Miss Symonds and I wish them every happiness in the future.

Covid~19

Further to the easing of some restrictions in England from 17th May we still need to maintain the practices of wearing face coverings and sanitising hands alongside existing mitigation measures regarding the cleaning and stewarding of Masses.

We are currently updating the risk assessments for Holy Souls' and St Bernadette's Churches which has taken a little longer than anticipated, however we will be seeking approval from the Diocese next week for a modest increase in seating capacity which will maintain social distancing at 1 metre. This will allow us to introduce some changes to the seating arrangements in both churches to increase the number of seats available for booking online for weekend masses.

We will also continue to consider any new information we receive regarding current Covid infection rates within our communities.

The restriction permitting only 30 mourners at Funerals has also been lifted, but we are still restricted to the capacity limit of our churches, so for the time being admission will continue to be limited to family guests only. The capacity limits for both Weddings and Baptisms have been increased to 30 people.

St Bernadette's ~ Eucharistic Adoration

Under the new guidance we are making plans to re-open the Adoration Chapel at St Bernadette's on a Monday. Tuesday, Thursday and Friday but the date is vet to be finalised. As the Chapel is a small space we also need to maintain social distancing.
