Father Matthew's Weekly Catechism

The Precepts of the Church.

There are five precepts of the Church. They set out the indispensable minimum for living as a good Catholic and growing in love of God and neighbour. Obviously, we should not aim for the bare minimum in the Christian life, we should aim to live so as to become God's friends, following the example of the saints. It is useful, however, to have the minimum set out for us so that we can aim higher. The precepts of the Church are additional to the Ten Commandments of Moses, which are similarly indispensable for the Christian life. The precepts of the Church are as follows in bold, with a commentary by me:

- To attend Mass on Sundays and other holy days of obligation, and to refrain from work and activities which could impede the sanctification of those days.** *At the moment the obligation to attend Mass has been temporarily lifted because the pandemic has made its fulfilment impossible for many people. Similarly, it can be impossible for many people to avoid working on Sundays and Holy Days, and God never asks the impossible of us. We simply aim to make these days as holy and restful as we can.*
- To confess one's sins, receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation at least once each year.** *This is a bare minimum. If people really desire to make spiritual progress, then they should be aiming to go to the sacrament of Reconciliation about once per month.*
- To receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least once each year during Eastertide.** *This precept will seem strange to many British people, because we tend to receive the Eucharist very frequently these days. We must remember to receive the Eucharist as often as we can without neglecting the necessary spiritual preparation.*
- To abstain from eating meat and to observe the days of fasting established by the Church.** *The Bishops of England and Wales have established for our countries, that we should abstain from meat on Fridays. There are also two annual fast days, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days we should abstain from meat and reduce the amount of food we eat in a way that is appropriate for our circumstances.*
- To help to provide for the material needs of the Church each according to his/her ability.** *The running costs of each parish increase annually, but when was the last time you thought of increasing the amount you give to the Church? The amount that each person can afford to give varies, but we can all afford something. Cardinal Hume once said that for someone in full time work they should give their wage for the first hour's work of the week to God.*

In your charity please pray for

all who have died recently, may they rest in peace. **Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.** Please pray for their families at this difficult time; for those whose anniversaries occur at this time; for all who are sick and housebound and those who have no family to support them. We remember all those who are in hospital or are having treatment, those whose treatment has been cancelled or postponed and those who are in nursing homes or being cared for at home.
