Father Matthew's Weekly Catechism

Holy Water.

I, like every other Catholic have grown in my understanding and appreciation of my faith over the years. The regard I have for holy water is one example of this. I have always regarded holy water as a positive thing, and regularly used it to bless myself with, like most other Catholics. However, it was only when I first became a parish priest that I first experienced its true effectiveness. I was told to live in a presbytery where certain things happened which I could not explain. I do not want to go into details, but things really did go bump in the night. I concluded that there were two possibilities, either I was experiencing a problem with my mental health and I should go and see a doctor; or there was a problem with the house of a spiritual kind. After about a month I decided I would bless the place with holy water, and if that didn't improve things, I would go and discuss my experiences with my doctor. That evening I blessed the house and sprinkled holy water. All I can say is that the nightly disturbances stopped instantly and never returned. By chance some time later I got talking to a man who had rented this house some years before. Without me saying anything he told me he and his wife had to leave because it was haunted, and he described exactly the same bangs and crashes that I had experienced! I told him of my own experiences and how I had blessed the place and hadn't had any further problems. "Father," he said, "Just you wait till I tell my wife how you got rid of that ghost!"

Holy water is known as a sacramental. Although it is not therefore one of the seven sacraments instituted by Christ, it does have a long history in the Church going back to apostolic times. It is also a means of grace and therefore a force for good in the world. It is blessed by an ordained minister, and it is used either in public liturgy for blessing or in private devotion. All baptized people may use holy water to bless themselves or their homes. It is also common practice for priests to come and bless the homes of the faithful.

The use of holy water in churches is currently restricted due to the Covid regulations. However, it can still be used in private devotion and blessings in the home. If you would like some holy water, it is available on request. Please bring a suitable water proof container to put it in.

In your charity please pray for

all who have died recently, may they rest in peace.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

please pray for their families at this difficult time; for those whose anniversaries occur at this time; for all who are sick and housebound and those who have no family to support them.

We remember all those who are in hospital or are having treatment, those whose treatment has been cancelled or postponed and those who are in nursing homes or being cared for at home.

It continues to be a privilege to accompany you on your journey of faith, be that in the celebration of Mass, Schools, hospitals, and to be present with you at both the highs and the low points of life in celebrating weddings, baptisms, and funerals. Thank you for generously allowing me to share in your lives. I hope there will be an opportunity for me to thank you personally nearer the time. I know that you will continue to generously support Fr Matthew, and whoever replaces me, across our four parishes and schools. For now, I ask that you please pray for Fr Neil and I as we take up our new appointments, and more importantly continue to ask the Lord to send labourers into his vineyard.
