Canon's Catechism

**How should I read the Bible?**

First of all, one should remember that every word in the Bible is inspired by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, one should read the Bible prayerfully, that is, with the assistance of the same Holy Spirit, always saying a prayer to the Holy Spirit before one starts to read. One can ask two questions: What is the message of the text at the time it was written? What is the message for me, now? A good commentary can be an invaluable help with this, such as the commentary of the Catholic Community Bible, which has a very thought-provoking, accessible commentary for the whole Bible, along with the text of all 73 books of sacred Scripture. As well as being the inspired Word of God, we must also remember that the text is of its time. It did not fall from heaven. It was composed by hundreds of human authors over a period of one thousand years. It will therefore reflect the time and culture which these men came from, and God willed it to be thus, because he always chooses to work through human beings, with all their strengths and weaknesses. The Bible is also the Church's book. The canon of Scripture (the list of the books of the Bible) was decided by the Church over the first four centuries AD. It should therefore be read and interpreted in harmony with the faith of the Church.

In your charity please pray for

all who have died recently, may they rest in peace. *Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.
